Minutes Regular Council Meeting Wednesday March 19, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Lowell Clawson called this meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
Council Members present were Butch McFall, Alan Thornton and Audra Thornton.
Others present were Clerk Ashley Hopkin. Attorney was available by phone if needed (but not present).
Employees present were water operator Debbie Good.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Public Comment: There was none.

Approval of the minutes for March 5, 2025, they were posted according to law. With no changes necessary, the minutes stand as written.

A motion was made by Alan Thornton, and seconded by Audra Thornton, to approve the agenda of March 19, 2025. Motion passed.

Monthly Reports:

Police: There was none.

Court: There was no court held this month. No citations were issued for the next court docket. The next scheduled court date is Wednesday April 2, 2025.

Water/Sewer: On March 12, 2025 the monthly BIO tests were taken to Energy Labs in Casper. The results came back fine. The chlorine is averaging 0.3 and the water tank level has been between 20.0 and 20.5 feet. There are no issues with the sewer lagoons.

Maintenance: The roads were sanded, serviced the trailers and greased them. Tires were put up at the shooting range at 25 yards and filled with sand. The Fire Departments AED boxes were hung up and the bench at Town Hall was sanded and recoated. Oil samples were pulled on the Cat equipment and sent in for testing. The burn pit was loaded and burnt, the snow from the last 2 storms was plowed and piled, the library was cleaned and the clinic building deck was cleaned off.

Fire: On March 10, 2025 a meeting was held where they had five volunteers present. They discussed and signed for ISPY phone apps, weekend schedule, and the town clerk updating their laptop. Drove all engines and brush truck.

Mayor's Report: The Town Clerk and Mayor have been working on items for the Town's audit with PMCH.

The mayor had a conversation with a possible candidate for the police officer position, the council discussed options and would like to have an interview with him.

The mayor and clerk has obtained a list of contractors to contact for the work needed at 107 Bluebell. They will call and get one of them to come and give the Town a quote for the repairs needed.

The Clerk and mayor have been contacting companies to find one who could add W.H. Smith to the bench in the clerk's office. They finally found a person in Rawlins who can do it. The bench slabs were delivered to them to get the name added.

Old Business: There was none.

New Business: A motion was made by Butch McFall, and seconded by Audra Thornton, to accept Mass Grading's quote of \$10,900.00 to mobilize equipment, and grind the town's concrete waste into usable gravel for the Town's use on roads or fill material. This will save the Town considerable money over purchasing gravel and having it hauled. Motion passed.

No executive session was needed.

A motion was made by Alan Thornton, and seconded by Audra Thornton, to pay check#17065 through check#17082, including all debit card charges and EFT's, for a total amount in bills \$9,356.01. Motion passed and Lowell Clawson abstained due to pecuniary interest. There was check#17076 in there for him.

With no further business this council meeting was adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
